## LAST ONE OUT KABUL/SAIGON: **A CONVERSATION WITH MILITARY LEADERS**


Thousands desperate to escape, the horrific images of the United States' departure from both Saigon and Kabul are forever etched in the memories of Americans who watched the events unfold on their television screens. A striking photo of a CH-46E Sea Knight flying over the roof of the U.S. Embassy in Kabul elicited immediate visual and emotional parallels with the Fall of Saigon, nearly fifty years before.

On October 15, Patriots Point will host a symposium on the US military's departure from Saigon, Vietnam and Kabul, Afghanistan. Two distinguished commanders from the Charleston area will share their personal experiences in each conflict and provide contextual insight into each situation's complexities and the policies contributing to their results.

#### **Officer's Staterooms**

These four-compartment berthing quarters provide a glimpse into the living environment afforded to the officers' rank. Bunked one or two to a room, their accommodations included wardrobes, a sink, desk, and more comfortable beds than the standard enlisted bunks.



The refurbished spaces reflect 1940s-era and 1960s-era compartments. The addition of air conditioning in the 1960s compartments is a noteworthy contrast.

#### Wing & a Prayer: The Joseph Kristufek Collection

Joseph Rudolf Kristufek served as a pilot with Torpedo Squadron Five (VT-5) during World War II. Primarily flying a TBF Avenger torpedo bomber, VT-5 made up part of the USS Yorktown's powerful arsenal on their first trip into the Pacific.



Kristufek said of his squadron, "Personally, I think that VT-5 is the best outfit, but I could be prejudiced." VT-5 would be stationed aboard the USS Yorktown until the end of her first war cruise in 1944.



During the Yorktown's shakedown cruise, a film crew captured footage for a Hollywood movie, A Wing and a Prayer: The Story of Carrier X. The film told a fictionalized reimaging of the Battle of Coral Sea and Battle of Midway. Kristufek and his Avenger would take center stage when footage of one of his many practice runs deploying a torpedo became part of the climactic film finale.
