MOUNT PLEASANT, S.C. – Patriots Point Naval & Maritime Museum will commemorate Veterans Day with a series of events from Saturday, November 8 through Tuesday, November 11, honoring the brave men and women who have served our nation. Activities will take place both aboard the USS Yorktown and at partner venues across the Lowcountry.

Saturday, November 8 | Art of Valor – USS Yorktown

The Patriot Art Foundation will host its annual *Art of Valor* workshop aboard the USS Yorktown. Veterans are invited to spend the day participating in watercolor instruction, live painting demonstration, and camaraderie with fellow service members. Echoes of Valor: Remembering WWII Through Story and Legacy – The Citadel

Patriots Point and The Citadel's Master of Arts in Military History program will co-host *Echoes of Valor* from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. in The Citadel's Class of 1969 Capers Auditorium.

Highlights include:

- Keynote address by Alex Kershaw, New York Times bestselling author and renowned World War II
 historian
- Panel discussion: "Legacy of the Greatest Generation: Personal Reflections from Descendants of WWII Heroes" featuring George Luz Jr., Tracy and Syndee Compton, and Chris Langlois, descendants of Band of Brothers and other WWII veterans
- Moderated by James M. Scott, Pulitzer Prize finalist, and Dr. Kyle S. Sinisi, professor of history at The Citadel

Tuesday, November 11 | Veterans Day - Patriots Point

To honor all who have served, veterans, active-duty service members, and their immediate families will receive free admission to Patriots Point Naval & Maritime Museum on Veterans Day, Tuesday, November 11.















From 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Patriots Point will also host an on-site donation drive in partnership with Operation Homefront, a national nonprofit that provides critical support to military families.

Requested donation items include:

- Non-perishable food items (canned goods, pasta, rice, beans, etc.)
- Small children's toys

Visitors who contribute to the drive will receive a \$3 voucher towards general museum admission.
